In the News ... County announces new Hate-bias Reporting Portal

Montgomery County announced a new hatebias incident complaint portal and a telephone hotline to simplify reporting hate-bias incidents to the County Police Department. Residents can report a hate-bias incident online at montgomerycountymd.gov/report-hate or calling the County's 311 Call Center from 7 a.m.-7 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The online form is meant to report things such as harassment, graffiti and violence against someone based on bias. This portal is not for reporting crime. A bias-related incident may be motivated by the same reasons as a hate crime but is different because the initial action did not rise to the level of a criminal offense. Education News Update

Maryland Department of Education released the 2024 Maryland School Report Card. Schools earn between one and five stars based on the percentage of points earned across a set of indicators that include academics, school quality and student success. Montgomery County schools that received 5-star ratings are —

County school board approves \$1.3 million boundary study contract — The school board must adopt new boundaries by March 2026 due to new schools opening in August 2027. The new openings include Woodward High School in Rockville, the expansion of Damascus High School and the new Crown High School in Gaithersburg. The boundary study will impact 19 of the county's 25 high schools and 31 middle schools. Elementary schools will not be impacted.

School field trips to the Museum of African American History and Culture during Black History Month.

The branch Education Committee is working with the Parent Council school reps to coordinate and fund the trips during Black History Month. A critical first step is working with the local school administration to find available dates and securing the (free) museum tickets for your schools preferred dates. To date, 35 Parent Council school reps are working to coordinate trips for their school in the upcoming year.

Kahlil Greene, 24, from Germantown has made the 2025 Forbes 30 Under 30 List under the social media category. He attended Yale and is the founder CEO and founder of "Gen Z Historian." Black History Moment . . . Tribute to Gloria White-Gardner

Tribute to Gloria White-Gardner who established the first National Association of Black Veterans (NABVETS) group in Montgomery County. White-Gardner consistently lobbied the Senate to recognize the legacy of the all Black female 6888th (Six Triple Eight) Battalion. She was successful and in 2022 the battalion gained National recognition.

Check out more on the history of 6888th Black women's battalion in the new Tyler Perry movie "The Six Triple Eight". It is the true story of the brave women of the first and only Women's Army Corps Unit of color to be stationed in Europe during World War II. It is scheduled to stream on Netflix on December 20.
